Journey Home Support began with a simple belief: that everyone deserves to spend their final moments with dignity and peace, in a space that reflects who they are, surrounded by the people they love.

For years, our doulas have sat at bedsides, held space for grieving families, and walked alongside people making some of the hardest decisions of their lives. What we have learned, again and again, is that when people feel informed, supported, and free to choose according to their own values, fear softens and peace becomes possible.

This booklet begins with who Journey Home Support is and what we believe, then introduces the Journey Home Sanctuary, a home we are building so that Medical Assistance in Dying, and every kind of end of life care, can be met with reverence rather than rushed through a clinical hallway. Journey Home Support

Empowered living and dying, rooted in dignity, choice, and connection.

Journey Home Support is a registered Canadian charity and the first and only end of life organization of its kind serving our community. We exist to normalize death as a natural part of life, not a failure, and to make sure no one has to face it alone.

We support individuals and families through illness, dying, and grief with free doula care, education, and advocacy. We help people understand their options, ask the right questions, and communicate their wishes clearly, so that every choice is grounded in their own values and in what is meaningful to them.

We are funded through donations, fundraisers, grants, and Second Journey Thrift, and every dollar helps us extend free, heart centred support a little further into our community.

What we believe

This is how we grow a community that knows how to care for one another.

- **Dignity.** Everyone deserves to spend their final moments with dignity and peace, in a space that reflects who they are.
- **Choice.** Knowing your options, medical, legal, spiritual, and personal, is what allows a person to choose according to their own values.
- **Presence, not management.** We are not a service that comes in to manage. We are a presence that walks alongside, sitting at the bedside and holding space for both silence and emotion.
- **Education as empowerment.** When people feel seen, understood, and supported, their decisions become clearer and more grounded in trust.
- **Dying is natural.** We believe dying is part of life, not a medical failure, and that it deserves the same love and preparation we give to birth.

Introducing the Journey Home Sanctuary

Ontario's first community based space for Medical Assistance in Dying, held in nature, in the hands of love and compassion.

Living with Intention. Leaving in Peace. Being Supported. Dying Empowered.

WHY

Dying and death deserve reverence.

The Sanctuary will honour the wholeness of a person, their wishes and values reflective of who they are, while holding and supporting the people who love them.

Most people say they want to die at home, surrounded by those who matter to them. Too few get that chance. Too many face their final days in clinical spaces built for treatment, not for peace.

Across Canada, Medical Assistance in Dying has become an increasingly meaningful option for those nearing the end of life. Yet there is currently no dedicated community space where individuals can choose MAiD outside a hospital or a private home, settings that can feel impersonal or overwhelming for families.

Journey Home Support is closing that gap. The Sanctuary will be a serene, home like environment designed specifically for end of life care, rooted in respect, dignity, and peace.

From the Sanctuary's guiding spirit

Death is natural. Let it be rooted in nature, surrounded by love, respect, and peace.

THE NEED

Why now

Family members of people choosing MAiD often find that home is not always emotionally or logistically possible, and facilities that do permit MAiD can still lack privacy, comfort, or spiritual space. Individuals are left to use clinical spaces, less preferred spaces, or to opt out of this provision altogether. The Sanctuary offers another way.

People received Medical Assistance in Dying in Canada in 2023, 4.7% of all deaths nationwide.

Year over year increase in MAiD provisions, up from 4.1% of all deaths in 2022.

As the need grows, so does the gap. Journey Home Support believes our community deserves a dedicated, non clinical place for this moment, one built with the same intention and care we would want for someone we love.



WHAT

A home, not a facility.

The Sanctuary is designed to feel like a home in nature, not an institution. Warm rooms for gathering. Quiet corners for reflection. Space outdoors for the rituals families need, from a fire lit in remembrance to a garden walk taken in silence.



Space to gather

Living rooms and fireside circles where families can be together, not stuck in a waiting room.



Space to be held

Private rooms where MAiD providers and doulas can do their work without anyone being rushed.



Space to say goodbye

Gardens and grounds that welcome goodbye parties and celebrations, embraced rather than hidden.

A WELCOMING HOME

A home for everything we offer

The Sanctuary will hold more than Medical Assistance in Dying. It is meant to be the physical home for everything Journey Home Support offers: end of life doula care, Peace of Mind Planning, community workshops and education, ceremonies and legacy projects, and our Death Doula Certification. A welcoming home to talk about the nature of life, long before its ending.

WHERE

Rooted in Hamilton

The Sanctuary will be built within the Greater Hamilton Area, close enough for the families we already serve to reach easily, and surrounded by the nature that makes it feel like home rather than a hospital. We are looking for land in the country that can host provisions outdoors and give loved ones the opportunity to walk the grounds in their grief.

Our vision for the Sanctuary

- A serene, home like setting for individuals choosing Medical Assistance in Dying
- A peaceful, non clinical space supported by trained death doulas
- Rooted in nature, compassion, and sacred presence, with spiritual care, ritual support, and grief companionship
- A space where families can gather before and after death without feeling rushed
- Inclusive and culturally safe care for 2SLGBTQ+, Indigenous, and low income individuals
- A replicable model for community based, dignified end of life care that other communities can one day follow

THE CAMPAIGN

A few things people ask us

Is Journey Home Support providing MAiD directly?

No. Qualified physicians and nurse practitioners conduct all MAiD assessments and provisions in accordance with Canadian law. Journey Home Support hosts individuals and their loved ones, offering a safe, non institutional space where that care can take place with dignity and support, free of charge.

Who can access the Sanctuary?

Adults who have been approved for MAiD under Canadian law and who are seeking a supportive, community based setting for that care.

What other support does Journey Home Support provide?

MAiD navigation and emotional accompaniment, Peace of Mind Planning, family support sessions before, during, and after death, holistic grief care, education and public workshops, and death doula training and mentorship.

Is Journey Home Support a registered charity?

Yes. Journey Home Support (registered as Journey Home for Empowered Living and Dying) is a registered Canadian charity. Our charitable registration number is 728048216 RR0001.

How is Journey Home Support funded?

We are funded through donations, fundraisers, grants, and Second Journey Thrift.
